Please remember that Material and Services Charges are legally recoverable.

As you are aware, the Government made a commitment to provide South Australian families with school-age children a \$100 per child discount on their public school's Materials and Services Charge for the next two school years (2022 and 2023).

Statements have been issued to relevant families, sent home via classrooms. School card approved families are not eligible for the rebate.

The rebate specifically relates to the Materials and Services Charges. If you have outstanding Material and Services Charges, the credit must be applied to this charge in the first instance. School card families who have outstanding fees and are waiting for their application to be approved cannot utilise the credit until a

final outcome from School Card is received. If eligible for School card the credit does not apply and will be cancelled.

If you have already paid your school fees in full for this year, see options below about how you can utilise the rebate. If you have not already indicated how you wish to utilise the rebate, or have any questions, please email

KEEPING SAFE: CHILD PROTECTION CURRICULUM

All teachers at Willunga Primary School teach the Child Protection Curriculum.

The KS:CPC is mandated in all Department for Education preschools and schools for children and young people from age 3 to Year 12.

The aim of this program is to teach children from a young age, in an age and developmentally appropriate way: to keep themselves safe.

There are four Focus Areas, which are examined in growing complexity in accordance with the age of the learners

- 1. The right to be safe
- 2. Relationships
- Recognising and reporting abuse
- 4. Protective strategies

Year 5 and 6 classes are currently participating in Growth and Development sessions run by Kidzbiz. These workshops cover core social, personal and sexuality development education and are mapped to the Australian Curriculum

The workshops help upper primary students understand how the reproductive system works and how amazingly it adapts to change. The sessions also help equip students making the transition from junior school to secondary school with a survival kit of skills: coping with physical and emotional body changes during puberty, making successful new friendships, surviving family conflicts, managing stress and pressures.

is still in progress with the Grand Final happening this week!


Their creative challenge to finish off, will be to complete something starting with the letter "T"
