ATTENDANCE

For students who are enrolled in school, it is mandatory that they attend from 8.45am to 3.05pm. We monitor student attendance, lateness, and early departure. We have noticed that a number

of families collect their children early and for some families, this is frequently. We ask that early departures are kept to a minimum. Often we need to call classrooms multiple times for early pick-ups which disrupts the class and is unfair to the other students and the class teacher who are trying to teach and learn. All early departures need to have a valid reason provided by the parent. If there is a pattern of early departure without a valid reason, families will be approached to apply for an exemption by the Principal as per the Attendance Policy which may or may not be approved, depending on the validity of the reason.

NUNGA GROUP AT WILLUNGA PRIMARY SCHOOL

Every Thursday all Aboriginal and Torres strait island students of our school meet with Bek and **James** for 'Nunga group'. This time is where students have the opportunity to learn about their culture and connect with other Aboriginal people. Activities involve; learning Kaurna language, painting, weaving, indigenous games, boomerang throwing, making damper and working in the garden. Students have developed positive relationships with each other by acknowledging their country and collaborating on different art works and games.

On Thursday of week 4 all students are invited to an Aboriginal Cultural Performance. The performance will involve traditional song and dance. It will be a great opportunity for all students of our school to be immersed in Aboriginal culture.

Our older students share their thoughts on 'Nunga group'.

'we call it Nunga group because Nunga is Nunga for Nunga'

'I like going to nunga group to hang out with Bek and James and throw the boomerangs.' **Michael.**

"We get to do cultural stuff and play indigenous games. **Monique** We get to play games, paint and we get to see other Aboriginal kids. Its good that I'm aboriginal. **Tyler.**

If's fun in Nunga group, we get to hang out with each other. **Emmie.**











ATSI PERFORMANCE

As part of our Aboriginal cultural experience at Willunga Primary School, we have invited Aboriginal artist David Booth and his sons to perform and share about their culture.

All students are invited to attend the performance in the hall on Thursday the 10th of November (week 4) at 9:30.

The performance will involve a traditional dance in full traditional attire. We will listen to a traditional story, see a Yidaki (didjeridoo) explanation and demonstration and watch and participate in a dance.

The cost for the incursion will be \$5 per student as per the parent consent notice sent home on Wednesday 26th October.

Learning science encourages students to develop a range of skills such as observation, prediction and communication as well as expanding their knowledge within and between the diverse domains of science. RESET ROOM TERM 4 FOCUS – RESILIENCE

Each term our Reset room has a focus for learning. The reset room is a space in our school where students can go to 'reset' and regulate their emotions. It is also a place where they can learn some skills to better manage when they are in the Blue, Red, Yellow or Green Zones.

Some students have scheduled time to learn these skills whilst they are in the Green zone, and some students use the room when they are needing a place to reset and regulate. Once in the room, and checked in; students are given opportunities to regulate and learn about how their brains and bodies work. All learning is based on the Zones of Regulation and are related to our school CARE values. Students then do some learning

based on the Personal and Social Capabilities from the Australian Curriculum, as well as the Health and Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum.

This term in the RESET room we are learning about RESILIENCE.

How do you bounce back when you are faced with a problem? Having problems, making mistakes, stressful situations, accidents and bad things do happen.

How can we train our brains how to cope and manage these difficult situations?

Who are your support people? What strategies do you use when a difficult situation presents itself? Do you have any strategies to pass on to your children?

It's important as parents that we

ask ourselves these questions before expecting our kids to know how to cope appropriately when a problem arises. Do we model resilience? Are there positive role models around? Do we rescue our kids or do we let them problem solve and learn strategies to help themselves?

There are many benefits of teaching resilience skills. Learning resilience skills helps manage challenge, change, stress and improves wellbeing.

One definition of Resilience: "Resilience is the ability to adapt to difficult situations. When stress, adversity or trauma strikes, you still experience anger, grief and pain, but you're able to keep functioning — both physically and psychologically."

MATERIALS AND SERVICES 2023

We are inviting parents and caregivers to attend the Governing Council meeting on 15th November at 6:30pm where we will be seeking final approval to charge \$360 in 2023.

In lieu of attendance at the meeting, parents and caregivers can express their views in writing to the Chairperson of the Governing

Council prior to the meeting.

We are introducing an Incursion levy of \$40 that will cover whole school incursions. This reduces the number of events we are seeking payment for across the year and which are a compulsory requirement in the Curriculum such as Footsteps Dance, Book Week performances and other whole school visiting performers. In future years we plan to include Swimming and Aquatics in the levy.

As well as minimising request for payment by families across the year it also reduces the impact at the site in relation to processing of payments for events that all which all students are participating. An incursion levy is a common practice in schools and one that supports streamlined processes for our Administration team.

I am sure you will agree that \$360 is certainly an excellent investment and is money well spent.
