Keeping Our Kids Cyber-Safe

Unfortunately, it has come to our attention that there is inappropriate use of technology outside of school hours by some of our students.

Social media platforms like TikTok and Snapchat are becoming ever so popular and parents need to keep an eye on what is being posted by their children.

Many of these platforms have an age limit of 13 years for children to be able to make an account. Photos of students wearing school uniform cannot be posted on social media without consent of the parent. Any photos of other students with hurtful messages or images of other students must not be sent.

What does Cyberbullying look like?

- hurtful messages, comments or images
- messages, posts or comments that say someone will do something mean
- leaving you out or ignoring you online
- spreading lies about you online
- creating fake online profiles in someone's name to trick you
- sharing something online that can hurt you or make you feel bad, like a picture you don't want anyone to see
- threatening to share something online that will hurt you or make you feel bad
- making you feel very sad, very scared or very upset



No one deserves to be hurt online.

Be kind to yourself and to others — report any unkind online behaviour

What to do if you feel there is negative content about your child online:

- 1. Students seek help from a trusted adult talk to your parents and the school.
- 2. Get help from the police if you are in immediate serious danger.
- 3. Try not to say anything back it could make things worse.
- 4. Keep evidence an adult can help you take screenshots or keep a journal in case you need evidence to report it.
- 5. Block or report them most games and apps have a way to block or report someone. See The eSafety Guide for links.
- 6. Report to eSafety https://www.esafety.gov.au/

Students are responsible for their actions outside of school hours where it has an impact on the wellbeing of others and the school environment.

Remember, students can be suspended or excluded by the school for behaviour that threatens the safety or wellbeing of a student, employee or another person associated with the school.


